

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

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


Burma Burma is one of the most popular vegetarian restaurants that serve Myanmar cuisine. They bring together the freshest of ingredients .

Hard Rock Café, Saket - 23.7 km from IICC



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

The Blue Bar - 20.1km from IICC

Housed at Taj palace, New Delhi the bar is swanky, edgy and exotic. The design is trendy and classy. The giant glass window panel overlooks the al fresco dining area. The reflection of overhead lights blending with city line looks stunning.



Summer House - 20.6 km from IICC

A super chilled, laid-back and "summer house-y" party vibe. You can get right in the middle and dance or sway to the music while sitting at a table admiring city views from the gorgeous rooftop. Fun fact: Coldplay's Chris Martin played an impromptu gig here on a trip to Delhi back in 2015.





The Delhi Golf Club – 26.8 km from IICC

DGC has a superb course which is popular for its picturesque views and has a great pub overlooking the course where you can truly unwind. Known for its 9 hole course & 18 hole course, it is easily accessible for non-members as all they need to do is pay a green fee.


DLF Golf and Country Club- 17.7km from IICC


Unesco World Heritage Site

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This tomb, built in 1570, is of particular cultural significance as it was the first garden-tomb on the Indian subcontinent. It inspired several major architectural innovations, culminating in the construction of the Taj Mahal.



Red Fort - 29.7 km from IICC

Named for its massive enclosing walls of red sandstone, The Red Fort is considered to represent the zenith of Mughal creativity which, under the Shah Jahan, was brought to a new level of refinement.




Qutub Minar - 18.3 km from IICC

Built in the early 13th century a few kilometres south of Delhi, the red sandstone tower of Qutb Minar is 72.5 m high, tapering from 2.75 m in diameter at its peak to 14.32 m at its base, and alternating angular and rounded flutings.



Historical Site

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East of Nehru place, this temple is built in the shape of a lotus flower and is the last of seven Major Bahai's temples built around the world. Completed in1986 it is set among the lush green landscaped gardens.



Swaminarayan Akshardham - 30km from IICC

Swaminarayan Akshardham in New Delhi epitomizes 10,000 years of Indian culture in all its breathtaking grandeur, beauty, wisdom and bliss. It brilliantly showcases the essence of India's ancient architecture, traditions and timeless spiritual messages.



India Gate - 23 km from IICC

A monument standing at the central junction of New Delhi, Protected by armed soldiers, it is a memorial tower built during the British colonial period to honor the souls of Indian soldiers who fought in World War I.



Museum/Gallery


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
National Museum - 22.4 km from IICC

The National Museum of India, it is one of the largest museums in Delhi. Boasting of over 200,000 works of foreign and Indian art, this museum covers more than 5,000 years of worldwide rich cultural heritage.



National Science Centre - 25.6km from IICC

Being a science museum, the National Science Centre is part of NCSM or National Council of Science Museums. The entire exhibit spans over 4 floors and is extremely popular amongst students. Six permanent halls hold interesting exhibits.



National Gallery of Modem Art -24.6 km from IICC

The National Gallery of Modern Art is one of the world's largest modern art museums to visit in Delhi with more than 14, 000 works by renowned and reputed Indian and foreign artists of worldwide fame.




Park/Garden

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Historical site, formely known as the place for the last kingdom's tomb of Lodi, became a public park with a beautiful nature. This is now managed by the Archeological Survey of India (ASI).



Mehrauli Archaeological Park - 17.6 km from IICC

This is a Historical area spread over 200 acre in Mehrauli, adjacent to Qutub Minar World Heritage site and the Qutub complex. It consists of more than 100 historical monuments.



Nehru Park - 19.5 km from IICC

The park is one of the most famous landmarks in Delhi. It is opened in 1969 and spread over 80 acres located in the downtown. This is a regular place for art events, morning yoga classes, and houses of ancient Shiv Temple and café.



Market

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


Operating since the 17th century, Khari Baoli is a street situated near the historic Delhi Red Fort, known for its wholesale grocery and Asia's largest wholesale spice market selling a variety of spices, nuts, herbs and food products like rice and tea.



National Crafts Museum - 25.2 km from IICC

The National Crafts Museum at Pragati Maidan is a great place to buy quality arts and crafts direct from the artisans. Every month, the museum hosts 25 different artisans from across India. The museum is open daily, except Mondays, from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. The entry fee is 20 rupees for Indians and 200 rupees for foreigners.



Sundar Nagar - 26.3 km from IICC

Gallery 29 has a fine collection of diverse Indian art from more than 40 talented artists. Kumar Gallery specializes in modern Indian art. Visit Curio Palace for brass and wooden handicrafts. Asia Tea House and Mittal Tea House both stock a vast variety of gourmet exotic teas.





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Holi Festival (All regions)

Holi festival is known as color festival which is one of the most popular festivals in India. Holi festival is organized every end of February to Mid of March to celebrate the start of spring.



Diwali Festival (All regions)

This is also called as the 'festival of lights' and is celebrated either in the month of October or November. People decorate their homes with lights and flowers. The whole country looks like a newly-wed bride on this day.



Durga Puja Festival (All regions)

Over the whole of Delhi, Durga Puja is celebrated by Bengalis with exuberance. The festival is celebrated with song and dance, fasting followed by feasts, elaborate decorations, and *pujas* or grand ceremonies at temples and religious recitals.





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
